Permit Requirements

- 1. Agricultural burning shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of this document, the California Fire Code Section 307, California Health and Safety Code Sections 41850-41866, and any other applicable codes and standards.
- 2. Burning shall only be conducted on valid burn days and hours declared by the YSAQMD who shall be contacted at (530) 757-3660 for the approved burn days and hours.
- 3. The Yolo Emergency Communications Agency (YECA) shall be notified prior to the ignition of any burning and can be contacted at (530) 666-8998 for the burn notification.
- 4. The permit is valid only on land owned or legally controlled by the permittee and shall be available for inspection at the burn site.
- 5. Material shall be arranged to facilitate efficient burning and shall be free of petroleum waste, demolition waste, construction debris, tires, rubber products, materials containing tar, metal salvage, car bodies or parts and other non-vegetative materials.
- 6. Vegetative waste shall be dried as required, shall be free of visible moisture, and only ignited with approved devices.
- 7. For non-agriculture business, burning shall only be conducted if other means of vegetation management are not feasible.
- 8. Fires shall be extinguished immediately if the fire is left unattended, producing smoke which is impacting inhabited areas within West Sacramento or any other city, ignited without a current permit, ignited on a 'no burn day' or outside burn hours as declared by YSAQMD, or is beyond control capabilities.
- 9. This permit may be revoked or suspended for violation of any requirement, misrepresentation, or as necessary for public safety.

Authorization

Any person who violates the provisions of these requirements is guilty of a misdemeanor and is punishable by imprisonment in the County Jail not exceeding six months or by a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or both, and the cost of putting out the fire.

The above statements are true to the best of my knowledge. I understand that permission to burn does not excuse the permittee from liability in the event the fire creates a nuisance or hazard.
